Curriculum Information

Our Topic for Term 5 is: 'The Great Fire of London'.

Our Topic work next term will be History based with a particular focus on The Great Fire of London. This topic is a personal favourite of mine and one I am sure the children will enjoy too. We will be looking at the events of 1666 alongside diary entries from Samuel Pepys.

Literacy— we will be using non-fiction texts based around The Great Fire of London to write diary entries and recounts based on the events.

Maths—we will be learning to tell the time to the nearest 15 minutes (quarter past, half past, quarter to and on the hour) and then progressing onto telling time to the nearest 5 minutes. We will continue to revise our addition, subtraction, multiplication and division strategies.

RE— our big question will be 'Who is a Muslim and what do they believe?'




SATS



Next term your child will be taking their Key Stage One (KS1) Standard Assessment Tests (SATs), which are administered at the end of year 2 to support teacher assessment in Reading, Writing, Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar, Mathematics and Science.

These tests will take place throughout May and will be carried out over the course of the month. The tests will be administered by your child's class teacher so that we can keep the tests as relaxed as possible. The tests are for Reading, Mathematics and GPS (Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation) which support Teacher Assessment. For each subject area there are 2 papers to complete covering different aspects of the curriculum. These tests are not strictly timed.
