We have had a fabulous Term 3 in Rowan class. The children have worked incredibly hard and have continued to be excited to learn.

This term we have been:

In English we have looked at the story Dear Dinosaur, and we have used the story to develop our speaking, listening, reading and writing skills. We have continued to develop our writing skills, by using adjectives to describe characters and settings and have done some fabulous writing, including descriptions and letters. We have also learned to use exclamation marks and question marks in our written work.

In Maths we began the term by focusing on place value to 20, and continued to consolidate our understanding of addition and subtraction. During our practical maths week we experienced measuring volume, capacity, height and length. We finished off the term recapping addition and subtraction, using resources.

In History we learned about dinosaurs and our Science lessons covered parts of the human body and parts of a dinosaur's body.

Next term

In Geography our focus will be "Bright Lights, Big City" with a focus on the 10 Things We Can Do To Help The World

In Geography we will find out about London and compare it to Newington, state our preferences and why.

In Science our focus will be plants.

Key vocabulary to learn
